Twice upon a time Maggie and I have been to Berlin. Once we went into the great department store in the main shopping street. There I made the acquaintance of a wonderful ice cream machine, and two elderly German ladies. I had a little difficulty with the machine, but I chose banana ice cream and the ladies helped me – unfortunately I had a great deal of difficulty in finding the stop control. Eventually we found it. Much to my surprise they sold it by weight. However it was delicious.

We crossed the road and found a haven; it was the Kaiser-Wilhelm Gedachniskirche, the Emperor Wilhelm memorial church – the memorial for those who lost their lives in the wars, and a place of reconciliation.

We went into the modern, octagonal hall of worship with its stunning, brilliant, blue glass windows – and were able to reflect and pray. For Maggie it also brought memories of Charles church which stands open to the skies in the centre of Plymouth, as a war memorial.

On our second visit, we walked around the Memorial to the murdered European Jews. It consists of 2711 sarcophagi like concrete columns, and you can join it at any point and reflect and remember. We were able to think back to our visits to Auschwitz.

Of course we were reminded of these events on the 8th May.

When he was born the angels sang "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom his favour rests." Luke 2.14
