The Mottisfont Oak



In their book Soulful Nature, spiritual writer Brian Draper and botanist Howard Green, go on 12 outdoor retreats, walking through rural, coastal and urban landscapes, noticing abundant gifts each season brings and cultivating a deeper sense of connection with the natural world. In May, they went around about the grounds of Mottisfont Abbey in Hampshire. I was struck by a great tree they came across!

"The Mottisfont oak is 1000 years old, give or take 200 years. It is squat with a good number of leafy branches in the summer...with a girth of around 37 feet...we struggle to take in the fact that its this old. Its trunk is gnarled like an over sized elephant's leg. Many of its branches are scarred; some are broken off, bare or storm damaged."

"And yet, here in May, is the wonder: that it is covered with new, fresh leaves, as new as life itself. Don't let anyone tell you that you cannot be a continual site for new life. The experience and wisdom of older age do not have to preclude fresh seasons of growth...John O'Donohue refers to the 'wild divinity of trees' and I'd like to think that it calls to something of the wild divinity in us. You are a wild soul, despite it all"

"The leaves, branches and roots combine to ensure as much of the sun's energy, and earth's goodness, is absorbed as possible. Would that we would become as absorbent."
