Jesus Light of the World

Usually we do a banner for church on the theme for Messy Church so – advance warning – Kit will be making the suggestion that this Christmas we send one Christmas Card on the theme Jesus Light of the World. Could we create our own cards instead of bought ones? So many of us are very creative – though we might not think so – a gift given to us by God. So use you talents and encourage your family. More information to come, so watch this space!

We normally have an item on prayer as one of the activities. So personally how about making your own daily / weekly prayer diary. Its easy to do. Take 3 pieces of

paper – all the same size or 2 pieces of paper and 1 of card – fold in half (card on top) – make 2 holes in the seam and thread through string/wool/ribbon and tie in a bow – this way you can add more sheets. Decorate your cover – maybe with the words – Jesus the Light of the World – and on the inside cover perhaps write a couple of your favourite bible verses. Label the top of each page with the day of the week and on the last page write down the list of people you are praying for. The back inside cover is your choice. Feel free to write under each day what you would like to pray for – people, church, country, government, schools etc. and notes and dates. I have found over the years it's fascinating to look back through and maybe see Gods answers. It's also a great document to pass on to your children in the years to come.
