We must preserve our natural carbon sinks, from the Amazon rainforest to our remaining UK woodlands, grasslands and wetlands, establish new ones, switch to climate-and-biodiversity-friendly farming, plant trees and open new greenspaces in our towns and cities.

We should use every tool God gives us. Pray for change, for our faith to sustain us in concerning times. Use our power as consumers. And critically use our voice and

vote to urge local and national politicians to use their much greater powers – to sign international agreements, pass laws, levy taxes, use the national budget to accelerate the right actions – to 'keep as close as possible to <u>1.5 degrees'.</u>"
