Sharing our faith

Faith is particularly important to any Christian. The question still remains – How often are we prepared to Share our Faith? How easy it for us to tell others about our Faith or what we believe in?

Jesus did not only send his disciples, later he sent many others 2 by two, since then, and he is sending us today are you ready? Jesus instructed his disciples to take nothing for the journey except staff: no bread, no money, no bag. Maybe by todays standard, to go on a journey without money and credit card, or mobile phone, that would present real problem. The idea is that we must have faith in Jesus, for he is there for us always, if only we can put our trust in him. Matt: 28 v 19 reminds us to go and make disciples of all nations.

It is not good to say that I am only a lay member, It is best to leave it to priests, clergy, Bishops, or ordained people. No, we are all baptised and all Christians, therefore we should be able to share our Faith with all those we come across. We are often better placed to share our faith and evangelize with those we come across. Lay people are crying out for teaching, guidance, and encouragement in living the Christian life. We must not forget what our Lord said "That the problem was not the harvest which was described as (plentiful) but not enough workers. We are all called to play our part. He also said that we should ask the Lord of the harvest in prayer to send out workers into his harvest field (Matt. 9. V. 38). Jesus needs us to work in his harvest field of saving souls. We are all called to win souls for Christ. Are you ready to play your part?
