CONVERSION.

There is Joy of Conversion according to the story of The Prodigal Son. Joy is a gift of the Holy Spirit (Galatians (5. 22) We know that this is Heavenly because heaven rejoices when just over one sinner repents or converts as in (Luke 15. 7). It is known that the joy of conversion is truly a divine and heavenly joy to believers.

Jesus attracted people like the tax collectors, prostitutes and were drawn by his acceptance of them. This made them open to what Jesus's teaching was all about, unlike the Pharisees who were scandalized by the company he kept. Jesus seized the opportunity to teach about his Heavenly Father.
