## "The Grace of Unity"

As the saying goes "United we stand divided we fall."

Unity is not easy, it doesn't come easily or naturally and it is hard won. Sometimes disunity can prevail in our homes, parishes, workplaces and communities.

That Jesus prayed for unity shows that it is a great grace coming from the God of peace as in John 17 - "That all of them may be one. Father." It is striking that Jesus' first words to the disciples after his resurrection were, 'Peace be with you' (John 20 19).
