Are you ready to take up your Cross?

We are called to lay down our lives just as Jesus laid down his life for us.

The cross was Jesus' hour of glory, so we too are called to take up our cross and follow Jesus.

This is only if we are willing to die to ourselves in this way, will we know the joy of harvest in our lives.

The Cross revels God's love, for as it makes it plain for all of us to see. St Rose of Lima once said that "The Cross is the only ladder that can take us to heaven". Jesus transforms everything, the Cross as an instrument of execution and death has become an instrument of life. Jesus did not shy away from his destiny, instead He recognised that in the Cross his "hour" had come, and that his whole life had been a journey to that moment.
