Praying the Way 2 – Maggie Marshall

During Lockdown John and I started using a book by Revd Terry Hinks called 'Praying the Way'.

'Through raw and authentic prayers, Terry Hinks leads us into the heart of the gospels to see more clearly the needs and joys of today's world. This highly originally book helps us to pray out of, and with, the words of Jesus and to discover the joy of prayer as a two – way conversation – listening as much as speaking to God.'

The book consists of 40 prayers to go with readings in Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. We are currently on number 22 in Luke and have yet to read the 40 in John, which should bring us nicely to the start of Advent.

I have chosen 5 prayers which go with readings:

Praying with Mark: Green Grass
As he went ashore he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd

Mark 6: 34

For times of rest and places that refresh and the one to whom we can open our hearts:

we thank you, life-giving God.

For the green grass, growing so abundantly

When the rains come and the parched land dreams its fill:

we thank you, life-giving God.

For the crowds of people, women and men, young and old,

For the one who looks at all with compassion,

whose words bring life and whose hands break bread:
