How strong is your faith? - by Revd John Ohen

In most cases faith always involves a battle between belief and doubt.

Faith believes the unbelievable, and it expects the unexpectable, and it hopes against hope, and trust against trust. Faith can move mountains and faith believes that through God and in God all things are possible.

The big question is "how big is your faith or what type of faith" do you have? Is your faith deep and sure, confident, and true; or is it weak and shallow? Is it faith that brings inner peace, grace, and healing, like in the case of Jairus' daughter and the woman who suffered from haemorrhage for twelve years? Jesus confirmed that it was her faith that healed her. "Take heart daughter - - your faith has healed you" (Matthew 9: v 22 NIV) and the woman was healed from that moment.

However, if we have faith, it will be **tested and refined**, regarding the way we think about God's intervention through miracles. The point to note here is that **faith** is **the ears and eyes of our souls.** Faith can move us to trust God more, especially when it comes to matters of life and death. Hebrew 11 (Faith in Action) Hebrew 11, has a lot to say about Faith and (V: 1) "Now faith is the confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see".
